The Art of Maria Karki—The True Nature of Mind. Maria Karki is equally at home using antique painting methods, digital photography and sculpture to explore the true nature of mind, the

search for spontaneity, and clarity shown in her art as the shimmering interface between presentation and abstraction. In her paintings she creates striking meditative images with colors drenched in intense sunlight and surfaces that glisten with the glaze of layer upon layer of thinned oils. Transformation is also at play in Karki's use of digital imaging tools to mine her digital photos for the small details that enlarged become entire universes. By pouring translucent resins into molds, assembled with found wood and onto natural stone basins, Karki gives us circular sculptures playing in the light..Norton Sculpture Garden, April 2008





